2 **out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for certain**
3 **expenditure, and for related purposes**

4 The Parliament of Australia enacts:

5 **Part 1—Preliminary**
6

7 **1 Short title**

8 This Act may be cited as the *Appropriation Act (No. 4) 2002-2003*.

1 **2 Commencement**

2 This Act commences on the day on which it receives the Royal
3 Assent.

4 **3 Definitions**

5 In this Act, unless the contrary intention appears:

6 ***administered assets and liabilities item*** means an amount set out in
7 Schedule 2 in relation to an entity opposite the heading
8 “Administered Assets and Liabilities”.

9 ***administered item*** means an amount set out in Schedule 2 opposite
10 an outcome of an entity under the heading “New Administered
11 Expenses”.

12 ***Agency*** has the same meaning as in the *Financial Management and*
13 *Accountability Act 1997*.

14 ***Commonwealth authority*** has the same meaning as in the
15 *Commonwealth Authorities and Companies Act 1997*.

16 ***Commonwealth company*** has the same meaning as in the
17 *Commonwealth Authorities and Companies Act 1997*.

18 ***current year*** means the financial year ending on 30 June 2003.

19 ***entity*** means any of the following:

- 20 (a) an Agency;
21 (b) a Commonwealth authority;
22 (c) a Commonwealth company.

23 ***expenditure*** means payments for expenses, acquiring assets,
24 making loans or paying liabilities.

25 ***Finance Minister*** means the Minister administering this Act.

26 ***item*** means any of the following:

- 27 (a) a State payment item;
28 (b) an administered item;

- 1 (c) an administered assets and liabilities item;
 2 (d) an other departmental item.

3 ***other departmental item*** means an amount set out in Schedule 2 in
 4 relation to an entity:

- 5 (a) opposite the heading “Equity Injections”; or
 6 (b) opposite the heading “Loans”; or
 7 (c) opposite the heading “Previous Years’ Outputs”.

8 ***Portfolio Additional Estimates Statements*** means the Portfolio
 9 Additional Estimates Statements that were tabled in the Senate or
 10 the House of Representatives in relation to the Bill for this Act and
 11 the Bill for the *Appropriation Act (No. 3) 2002-2003*.

12 ***Portfolio Budget Statements*** means the Portfolio Budget
 13 Statements that were tabled in the Senate or the House of
 14 Representatives in relation to the Bill for the *Appropriation Act*
 15 *(No. 1) 2002-2003* and the Bill for the *Appropriation Act (No. 2)*
 16 *2002-2003*.

17 ***Special Account*** has the same meaning as in the *Financial*
 18 *Management and Accountability Act 1997*.

19 ***State*** includes the Australian Capital Territory and the Northern
 20 Territory.

21 ***State payment item*** means an amount set out in Schedule 2
 22 opposite an outcome of an entity under the heading “Specific
 23 Payments to the States and Territories”.

24 **4 Portfolio Budget Statements and Portfolio Additional Estimates** 25 **Statements**

- 26 (1) The Portfolio Budget Statements and Portfolio Additional
 27 Estimates Statements are hereby declared to be relevant documents
 28 for the purposes of section 15AB of the *Acts Interpretation Act*
 29 *1901*.

30 Note: See paragraph 15AB(2)(g) of the *Acts Interpretation Act 1901*.

Section 5

1 (2) If the Portfolio Budget Statements or Portfolio Additional
2 Estimates Statements indicate that activities of a particular kind
3 were intended to be treated as activities in respect of a particular
4 outcome, then expenditure for the purpose of carrying out those
5 activities is taken to be expenditure for the purpose of contributing
6 to achieving the outcome.

7 **5 Notional payments, receipts etc.**

8 For the purposes of this Act, notional transactions between
9 Agencies are to be treated as if they were real transactions.

10 Note: This section applies, for example, to a “payment” between Agencies
11 that are both part of the Commonwealth. One of the effects of this
12 section is that the payment will be debited from an appropriation for
13 the paying Agency, even though no payment is actually made from the
14 Consolidated Revenue Fund.

Part 2—Basic appropriations

6 Summary of basic appropriations

The total of the items specified in Schedule 2 is \$263,750,000.

Note 1: Items in Schedule 2 can be increased under Part 3 of this Act and under section 12 of the *Appropriation Act (No. 1) 2002-2003* (as modified by section 12 of the *Appropriation Act (No. 3) 2002-2003*).

Note 2: See also section 30A of the *Financial Management and Accountability Act 1997*, which provides for adjustment of appropriations to take account of GST.

7 State payment items—basic appropriation

- (1) For a State payment item for an outcome of an entity, the Finance Minister may issue out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund amounts that do not exceed, in total, the lesser of:
 - (a) the amount specified in the item; and
 - (b) the amount determined by the Finance Minister in relation to the item, having regard to the expenses incurred by the entity in the current year in relation to the item.
- (2) An amount issued out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for a State payment item for an outcome of an entity may only be applied for the purpose of making payments to or for the States for the purpose of contributing to achieving that outcome.

8 Administered items—basic appropriation

- (1) For an administered item for an outcome of an entity, the Finance Minister may issue out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund amounts that do not exceed, in total, the lesser of:
 - (a) the amount specified in the item; and
 - (b) the amount determined by the Finance Minister in relation to the item, having regard to the expenses incurred by the entity in the current year in relation to the item.

Section 9

- 1 (2) An amount issued out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for an
2 administered item for an outcome of an entity may only be applied
3 for expenditure for the purpose of carrying out activities for the
4 purpose of contributing to achieving that outcome.

5 Note: The acquisition of new administered assets will usually be funded
6 from an administered assets and liabilities item.

7 **9 Administered assets and liabilities items—basic appropriation**

- 8 (1) For an administered assets and liabilities item for an entity, the
9 Finance Minister may issue out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund
10 amounts that do not exceed, in total, the amount specified in the
11 item.

- 12 (2) An amount issued out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for an
13 administered assets and liabilities item for an entity may only be
14 applied for expenditure for the purpose of carrying out activities
15 for the purpose of contributing to achieving any outcome that is
16 specified in relation to the entity:
17 (a) in Schedule 2 to this Act; or
18 (b) in Schedule 1 to the *Appropriation Act (No. 3) 2002-2003*; or
19 (c) in Schedule 2 to the *Appropriation Act (No. 2) 2002-2003*; or
20 (d) in Schedule 1 to the *Appropriation Act (No. 1) 2002-2003*.

21 **10 Other departmental items—basic appropriation**

- 22 (1) For an other departmental item for an entity, the Finance Minister
23 may issue out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund amounts that do
24 not exceed, in total, the amount specified in the item.

25 Note: Generally, the Finance Minister is permitted, but not obliged, to issue
26 the amounts out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund. However,
27 subsection (3) imposes an obligation on the Finance Minister to issue
28 the amounts in certain circumstances.

- 29 (2) An amount issued out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for an
30 other departmental item may only be applied for the departmental
31 expenditure of the entity.
32 (3) If:

1 (a) an Act provides that an entity must be paid amounts that are
2 appropriated by the Parliament for the purposes of the entity;
3 and

4 (b) Schedule 2 contains an other departmental item for that
5 entity;

6 then the Finance Minister, under subsection (1), must issue out of
7 the Consolidated Revenue Fund the full amount specified in the
8 item.

Part 3—Additions to basic appropriations

11 Other departmental items—adjustments and borrowings

5

(1) The Finance Minister may determine that the amount specified in:

6

(a) an other departmental item in this Act; or

7

(b) an other departmental item in the *Appropriation Act (No. 2) 2002-2003*;

is to be increased by an amount specified in the determination.

10

(2) The total of the amounts determined by the Finance Minister under subsection (1) cannot be more than \$20 million.

(3) The Finance Minister must give the Parliament details of increases made under this section.

12 Advance to the Finance Minister—unforeseen expenditure etc.

15

(1) This section applies if the Finance Minister is satisfied that:

16

(a) there is an urgent need for expenditure that is not provided for, or is insufficiently provided for, in Schedule 2; and

17

(b) the additional expenditure is not provided for, or is insufficiently provided for, in Schedule 2:

19

(i) because of an erroneous omission or understatement; or

21

(ii) because the additional expenditure was unforeseen until after the last day on which it was practicable to provide

22

for it in the Bill for this Act before that Bill was

24

introduced into the House of Representatives.

25

(2) This Act has effect as if Schedule 2 were amended, in accordance with a determination of the Finance Minister, to make provision for so much (if any) of the additional expenditure as the Finance Minister determines.

(3) The total of the amounts determined by the Finance Minister:

30

(a) under this section; and

31

(b) under section 12 of the *Appropriation Act (No. 2) 2002-2003*;

1 cannot be more than \$215 million.

2 (4) The Finance Minister must give the Parliament details of amounts
3 determined under this section.

2 **Part 4—Miscellaneous**

4 **13 Crediting amounts to Special Accounts**

5 If any of the purposes of a Special Account is a purpose that is
6 covered by an item (whether or not the item expressly refers to the
7 Special Account), then amounts may be debited against the
8 appropriation for that item and credited to that Special Account.

9 **14 Conditions etc. applying to State payment items**

10 (1) This section applies to any payment made out of money
11 appropriated by a State payment item for an outcome identified in
12 column 2 of the table in Schedule 1.

13 (2) The payment:
14 (a) must be made on the applicable terms and conditions (if any)
15 for that outcome; and
16 (b) must be made in the amounts, and at the times, that are
17 determined in writing by the Minister specified in column 4
18 of the table.

19 (3) This section does not, by implication, limit the power of the
20 Commonwealth to:
21 (a) apply terms and conditions to non-State payments; or
22 (b) determine the amounts and times of non-State payments.

23 (4) In this section:
24 ***applicable terms and conditions***, in relation to an outcome
25 identified in the table in Schedule 1, means terms and conditions
26 from time to time determined (either before or after the
27 commencement of this Act) in writing by the Minister specified in
28 column 3 of the table as being the terms and conditions that apply
29 to payments that are made to or for a State in relation to that
30 outcome out of money appropriated by an annual Appropriation
31 Act.

1 *non-State payment* means a payment made out of money that is
2 appropriated by the Parliament (either under this Act or another
3 Act), other than a payment out of money appropriated by a State
4 payment item.

5 **15 Appropriation of the Consolidated Revenue Fund**

6 The Consolidated Revenue Fund is appropriated as necessary for
7 the purposes of this Act.
